INQUIRY Prep—Year 2

In Prep / 1 / 2 at Kinglake Primary School, we have had a very special visitor join us for our Inquiry Unit. We have a Yellow-bellied Glider visiting our classroom!

We named our new friend Nibbles and Fluffy and we have learnt so much about Yellow-bellied Gliders and their ideal ecosystem. We learnt that Nibbles and Fluffy live in wet forests and rainforests just like Kinglake National Park.

We created a habitat for out Yellow-bellied gliders to stay in. We created the bark and branches of a Eucalyptus tree which Yellow-Bellied Gliders live in. We also added the information we have learnt onto the leaves of the tree.

We have learnt about the Yellow-bellied Gliders Diet, Location and Threats. Nibbles and Fluffy love to eat pollen, nectar, and sap from the Eucalyptus trees. Yellow-bellied Gilders live along the eastern coast from Southern Queensland all the way down to Victoria. Some threats of the Yellow-bellied Glider are foxes, logging, and barbed wire fences.







We had 2 Park rangers come out and tell us about Nibbles and Fluffy and their environment. Park Ranger Kim told us all about Yellow-bellied Gliders and did a fun activity with us. She also answered some of the Wonderings we had about the Yellow-bellied glider. Landcare Kinglake have been a great support and have visited on a number of occasions to help answer our questions and support our learning.

Students have been able to take Nibbles and Fluffy home to do fun outdoor activities to connect with their local environment, students have then shared about the fun they had in the class take home journal.

We have now set targets to ensure our school forest is a safe and accessible place for all gliders. We have begun working with Landcare to identify and clear the weeds strangling out large trees. We are in contact with a community group who will help us work towards building a rope bridge to help glider access our fragmented forest. Students have already begun making posters to inform the community about what can be done to protect our forest and the Yellow-bellied glider.
